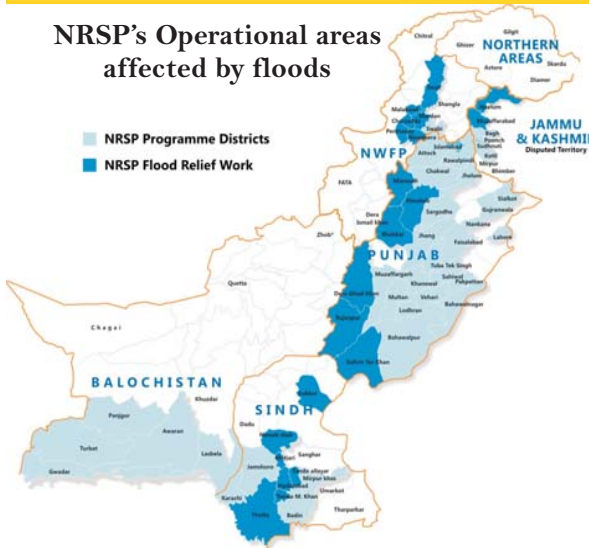




NRSP Emergency Response Floods 2010

Warehouse facilities at NRSP:

NRSP has a chain of warehouses that are/have been used for emergency relief operations. The largest such warehouse is in Sehala with a capacity of 200,000 cft storage space. Others are in Bahawalpur (Punjab), Aza Khel (KpK), Turbat (Baluchistan), and Muzaffarabad (AJK). With a unique network of stockpiling facility, NRSP has the capacity to respond to the emergencies in any part of Pakistan. An appropriate inventory management system and trained warehouse managers are on board to control the in and outflow of the relief goods.

Floods 2010:

Since July 21st, 2010, Pakistan has experienced heavy monsoon and unusual flash floods which have brought havoc throughout Pakistan in all the four Provinces and AJK. Widespread losses of human lives, houses, property, crops and physical infrastructure have been reported by the National Disaster Management Authority which reported 1,802 human losses, 2,994 persons seriously injured and damage to 1,910,439 houses.

NRSP's Response to Floods 2010:

NRSP, having nationwide presence, has presence in all flood affected Districts of Khyberpaktunkhawa, Punjab and Sindh Provinces with a network of grass roots level Community Organizations and a cadre of trained activists. Like previously in Earthquake 2005, NRSP responded to the Floods 2010 and started emergency rescue operations in worst hit areas of KpK and Punjab Provinces. Since the start of floods, NRSP is busy in Emergency Relief operations in all the affected Districts. The salient features of NRSP's response to Floods 2010 are:

- NRSP established Emergency Response Center at its Head Office. Likewise Regional Emergency Response Centers

were established in Nowshehra (KpK), Dera Ghazi Khan, Mianwali and Rahim Yar Khan (Punjab), Muzaffaranaf (AJK) and Sukkur (Sindh).

- NRSP allocated Rs. 16 million for immediate relief goods which included food and water
- NRSP conducted a Rapid Assessment of the flood damages through its network of CBOs and community activists
- NRSP is working in close coordination with National and Provincial Disaster Management authorities, Provincial and District Governments and Line Departments
- NRSP regional and District offices have been declared Coordination Hubs for public and private sector organizations engaged in emergency relief operations
- NRSP focused provision of food & water, shelters, medical aid and Hygiene kits sensitive to the needs of women and children
- NRSP initiated a campaign for mobilizing resources and networked with UN, USAID, Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund, International Humanitarian Aid agencies, particularly Shelter Box, Rotary International and Diakonie and number of local stakeholders.

NRSP Emergency Response Floods 2010

As of **December 6, 2010** NRSP has provided relief goods to over **815,778** households since the beginning of the floods. These include:

- ❖ Provision of tents/shelters to **54,545** households
- ❖ Food items and water to **483,915** households
- ❖ Medical aid to **198,249** households
- ❖ Clothing for **28,368** households
- ❖ Livestock care for **22,022** households, and
- ❖ Non-Food items for **22,936** households.

NRSP's Strategy for Emergency Relief and Appeal for Donations

NRSP has presence throughout Pakistan with a network of offices in all flood affected Districts in KpK, Punjab, Sindh, Balochistan

and AJK. NRSP's staff trained in Emergency Relief has been deputed to monitor the relief operations round the clock. The Emergency Relief Centers at Head Office and Regional Offices are interlinked through online database sharing and information management.

NRSP foresees provision of Food, Shelter and Hygiene as the most pressing needs of the affected households. NRSP has prepared a Food Item Package/Food Hamper for two weeks. Likewise a Hygiene kits has been developed for the affected families, particularly to cater the needs of women and children. These packages include following items:
